Key achievements 2023-2024

Activity/Action	Impact	Comments
Pupils to be offered a range of after school sports clubs.	A range of sporting activities are offered afterschool each week which during the year included football, multi sport, dance, gymnastics, baseball, athletics, tag rugby, tennis, cricket and dodgeball. 168 different pupils attended an afterschool sporting club during the academic year. Rivers have been represented in school sport by 196 different pupils at 40 different sporting events during the academic year in competitive, friendly and festival events.. The school is also a host site for the HAF program offering sporting activities in the Winter, Easter and Summer holiday. This has supported more children meeting at least 30 minutes of physical activity through providing a broad range of activities to meet the needs of all children.	
Coaching for teachers	The PE specialist has worked alongside class teachers to demonstrate good practice in PE lessons. PE specialist has also provided advice and support to staff in school through sharing of resources and informal support. This has supported confidence of class teachers in delivering PE especially ECTs.	
Physical wellbeing and fundamental movement skill intervention sessions	Extra weekly Physical Education sessions for children that need support with physical motor skills, fitness, confidence in school or sport to ensure our program is fully inclusive to all. These sessions are provided for 50 children per term in small groups of no more than 10, with children enjoying and progressing in these sessions fantastically. This has improved motivation for children involved to successfully take part in PE lessons and clubs as well as be more physical active.	
Physical activity embedded	Playground markings successfully installed at Rivers Primary Academy. This has
